Comparison between National Data and Great Abington Cohort 2026

Attainment measure	National data	Great Abington Primary	Difference
Achieving the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths	63%	90%	+27%
Achieving the expected standard in Reading (SAT)	75%	95%	+20%
Achieving the expected standard in Writing (teacher assessment)	73%	90%	+17%
Achieving the expected standard in Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SAT)	74%	95%	+21%
Achieving the expected standard in Maths (SAT)	75%	100%	+25%
Achieving the expected standard in Science (teacher assessment)	82%	90%	+8%

Scaled scores - individual subjects

The DfE uses scaled scores to report the results of tests so they can make accurate comparisons of performance over time. Scaled scores range from 80 to 120 with 100 being the expected standard and 110 and above being the greater depth standard. The total number of marks a pupil achieves in each test subject (raw score) is converted into a scaled score to ensure accurate comparisons can be made over time, even if the difficulty of the test itself varies.
